Heat Pump Equipment Rebate Overview

Available for existing Commercial, Multifamily and Small Residential buildings with heating, cooling or hot water systems.

Standard rebates are designed to cover the cost difference between gas-fired systems and electric heat pumps.

All Denver rebates require pre-approval prior to equipment installation.

2023 Year-in-Review

- Updated rebate process and portal for Residential Rebates
- Implemented a pre-approval/reservation process for Residential Rebates and online budget tracker to improve confidence in rebate availability
- Launched Commercial/Multifamily Heat Pump Equipment Rebates for existing buildings - HP RTUs, ASHPs, mini-splits and HPWHs
 *Stackable with Xcel Energy's recently launched commercial heat pump equipment rebates



Looking forward to 2024

- No changes to rebated measures or equipment eligibility for heat pump equipment rebates on Jan 1, 2024
- Continuing coordination with Xcel Energy across all programs and measures
- Working on additional assistance, trainings and incremental improvements to processes
- Launching additional Commercial/Multifamily equipment rebates beyond just HP RTUs, ASHPs, mini-splits and HPWHs

As a contractor, you are the homeowner's connection to Denver's Home Energy Rebates, since you will be the one receiving the rebate from the city and applying it to the customer's bill.



Instructions for Installers Applying for Rebates

All rebates offered through Denver's Home Energy Rebate Program must be pointof-sale rebates to customers. Rebates must be shown as a rebate or credit to the customer's signed agreement in order to qualify.

You may reserve rebates before the project is complete with a signed customer agreement.
